Overall, TMAT saw a regression and needed significant technical assistance in the day to day operations.

Due to a construction project TMAT incurred new debt through a PACE loan and additional debt on the mortgage. TMAT deficient spent for the majority of months during the 2024-2025 school year.

TMAT continues to file documents in a timely manner and manages compliance requirements appropriately

**Areas of Improvement:** TMAT received their 2nd strike on the At-Risk of Closure list. Academics must be an area of focus for improvement. Stability in staffing will support the academic improvement. TMAT will need to put themselves in a positive fiscal position moving forward. Trends in the academic, operational, and fiscal functions of the school may put TMAT contractual renewal at risk.
